## **Lesson Thirteen- What about the Future? Scripture- Matthew 24:1-8**

**Memory verse- Revelation 21:4,** "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away."

INTRODUCTION- "The best is yet to come" is a reality from the standpoint of our Saviour. But, the truest adage for mankind might be that "we ain't seen nothing yet!" Certainly, suffering will increase on earth, "perilous times shall come" (II Timothy 3:1), "and because of iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold" (Matthew 24:12). Christ told His disciples that "great tribulation" will come such as the world has never seen (Matthew 24:21). But, Christ also instructed His disciples that "when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh"

(Luke 21:28). The Bible is filled with many wonderful prophecies that have been fulfilled already; however, there are many predictions that have not yet been accomplished. We live in a special time in the history of mankind, which the prophet, Daniel, called "the time of the end" (Daniel 8:17, 11:35,40, 12:4,9). During these "end times", we see our world in chaos. Nature seems at war with mankind as catastrophic events pound against civilization. False teachers, violent religions, and scientific theories assault the foundation stones of nations originally founded upon God's Word. Political powers and "rulers... in high places" (Ephesians 6:12) delude themselves and arrogantly believe they have become the world's "messiah". Is it any wonder that God must "wipe away all tears from their eyes" one day? In this final lesson of our study, let us briefly answer the question on the hearts of many people—What about the Future?

		7.	<b>Earthquakes (v.7).</b> Just one earthquake in Haiti in 2010 took the lives of 316,000 people, and severe earthquakes were more frequent in the 20 <sup>th</sup> century than in any other century before.
